COVID-19 Protocols for 2021

General Protocols

The health of campers, families, and staff is the top priority, and so Hallockville will be implementing these protocols during the 2021 Farm Camp.

- cohort sizes of not more than 15 campers.
- no or minimal interaction between cohort groupings.
- campers required to wear face coverings when necessary.
- staff required to wear face coverings when within 6 feet of a camper.
- social distancing among campers, as much as reasonably possible.
- no sharing of food, snacks, or drinks.
- minimal sharing of other items, as much as reasonably possible.
- daily temperature checks and screening questions prior to drop-off.
- increased use of hand sanitizing.
- immediate isolation of a camper who becomes ill during the camp day.
- contacting local health authorities if a person associated with camp tests positive for COVID-19 so that contact tracing can be initiated.

But keeping campers and staff healthy is a **shared responsibility** and so we would greatly appreciate your cooperation and assistance as follows:

- families should minimize risk factors; i.e., practicing social distancing, wearing face coverings when necessary, exercising proper hand-washing hygiene, minimizing exposure to non-family members.
- educating campers about minimizing exposure to COVID-19.
- educating caregivers about minimizing exposure to COVID-19.
- follow directions of camp staff during pick-up and drop-off.
- most important-- do **not** come to camp if your camper has an elevated temperature (i.e., greater than 100.4 F); is experiencing COVID-19 symptoms; or otherwise does not feel well. The camper will not be admitted to camp in such situations.

COVID-19 Refund Policies

Campers who test positive, show symptoms, or have been otherwise been exposed to COVID-19 within 20 days of their first day at camp may **not** attend camp and their registration will be cancelled. Camp tuition in these cases will be refunded per our refund policy as if the cancellation was made prior to June 1, 2021.

If the Camp is not able to operate for a portion of the full period of a weekly session in which your child is registered due to directives received from State, County or Town officials, the Camp will refund payments made for that session less any proportionate tuition and less any amounts due on the account for that session. For example, if a five day session is cancelled due to a direct COVID exposure on Wednesday, a proportionate refund will be issued for Thursday and Friday.
